**** MASTER'S ESSAY DIRECTION:**

You must have participated in the Master's Essay Workshop that was held during the Fall Term in order to register for the Master's Essay Direction. Also, please complete an Authorization for Master's Essay form available in the Law School Records Office and on the Law School website and **submit the signed form to the Law School Records Office for processing no later than the end of the second week of classes in the term.**

The essay required for the LL.M. degree may be elected as either Master's Essay Direction (LEX 8999) for 2 semester hours, and writing the paper independently under the supervision of a professor, or, by signing up for a seminar, if one is offered in your major field, and doing your paper under the supervision of the professor teaching the seminar.

If you elect to take a seminar to meet the paper requirement, you should register for Master's Essay Direction (LEX 8999), 2 hours; and Directed Study (LEX 7990), 1 hour. (Do not register for the seminar.) Please notify the Law School Records Office by completing the Master's Essay Direction form with the name of the seminar you will be taking to complete the essay requirement.

The total number of semester hours of credit required for the LL.M. degree is twenty-six (26) whether you do your paper in a seminar or independently.

There are instructions listed in the LL.M. Degree Requirements and Academic Regulations booklet for the writing of the Master's Essay.

Any student not completing their Master's Essay in the term elected MUST register for at least one credit of essay direction each semester that he/she uses facilities or receives advisory services until such time as the student:

- a) completes the requirements for the degree;
- b) declares him/herself no longer a candidate for the degree; or
- c) exceeds the time limit allotted for securing the degree.

For these credits, the student will pay customary fees and will register as an auditor. No degree credit will be granted for these elections which are beyond the required credits for an essay. A mark of Z (audit) will be recorded on the student's record for additional elections.
