- A cover letter describing any background or experience relevant to the study of international law. These can include jobs, internships, travel, family background and courses taken in law school or as an undergraduate
- A writing sample involving legal research and analysis that is in substantial part your own work
- A current resume
- A current law school transcript, either official or unofficial
